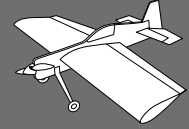

Secretary's Report

for September 11, 2007 membership meeting, by Mel Suarez

Al Prudhomme opened the meeting at 7:30pm at the Lexington VFW.

Al visited Central Masss RC Flyers out of Westboro Mass. "Warm welcome to everyone here."

"The field day and BBQ was amazing. I could not hope for more help on the cooking. I appreciate it very much."

Carl Dietrich – Mel introduced Carl, CEO of Terrafugia (www.terrafugia.com), a Woburn-based aircraft design company. Carl started by showing an amazing animation of the Transition landing and then being driven to a regular home and right into its garage! The Transition® is a general aviation (GA) airplane designed to be a light sport aircraft. Max gross weight of 1300 lbs, canard in front, elevator in the back, you're sitting in the front of the wing. The really strange thing is you turn off the motor. We are building a proof-of-concept car to fit in the standard garage – 7 ft high door. It has a very unique set of advantages.

When light sport came along, we saw it as a huge opportunity. 100 concepts have come along, some of which were certified by the Civil Aeronautics Administration. There are about 5,000 airports around the country. You can get around bad weather. The 2nd leading cause of accidents is bad weather – when "get-there-it is" sets in. Cost: no hangar fees \$600/mo, can use auto gas (not avgas), no need for secondary means of transportation. Most of the 5,000

airports don't have rental or taxi stands. Door-to-door time is reduced significantly.

New "Light Sport Aircraft Rule" LSA. New rule allowed aircraft to go through certification in under a year, thus a few million dollars.

No restriction on how far you can go, just on the type of airspace you can go into. We have seen over 2,100 new pilot starts in the last couple of years. It's really an emerging market where a startup can make a difference.

Also, you don't need an FAA Medical Certificate, just a driver's license. Because of the vehicle limitations and kinetic energy at their disposal, you can do less damage.

Several folks asked questions.

How would you register and insure it? For full Fed Vehicle Compliance it would take 10(!) vehicles just for crash testing. You can't get a regular mechanic. This is not a car, this is an aircraft that can go on the road.

What are you doing for emissions? We are modifying the engine to make it pass the standards and pass the emissions test. We've hit some milestones including an RC flying prototype. We would like to sell it at \$150,000. We have to have a stall speed of 45 knots or less.

end of 2009. The wing has been built and was exhibited at Oshkosh with standard aircraft construction techniques. How's the drive train work? We have a many off-the-shelf items. Once the proof-of-concept is built, we will go back and change those items to better lightweight design. We will be attempting to go into low volume production – 10's of units at first. If we got to 1,000 units per year, that would be unbelievable. If we got 200 units per year that would also be unbelievable. During the meeting, people signed up for additional information from Terrafugia. You can do so by going to their web site.

Mel read the meeting minutes from the last meeting in June, 2007.

Treasurer's Report

\$1,558. Balance \$1,160. We have commitments and will be lucky to finish with a positive balance.

Membership Report

John Hatfield reporting. Last 4 years - 118, 114, 96, 71. Significant drop in membership. Dues went up in 2004(?). We cannot continue spending this way unless we get more members. \$2,400 per year. 60 members would allow us to break even with basic costs.

Show and Tell

Mike Carroll – Said that several people asked that he tell the story of his heli that flew away. He had a Raptor 30 that he bought, unfinished for \$75 at an Airbot gig. He proceeded to put all the electronics in it and got it flying fine. Mel lent him a co-pilot that keeps the helicopter level and works quite well. One day, after some repairs, he was in his backyard, checking it out when it refused to come down. Instead, it went up and up and pretty soon the wind caught and took it away.

About 2 weeks later, it showed up in his front steps. No note. No anything. Luckily he had placed his business card in it and the founder of it simply returned it!

Mel Suarez & Mike Carroll– showcased their "new" Bergen Observer with a Zenoah 23 and built-in camera rig purchased through eBay. It's Airbot's second helicopter, has a 5 ft diameter rotor, and the camera gimbals are extremely smooth and promising.

Mel Suarez brought in a used Shogun electric heli that he got for \$275. He said the problem is the JR analog transmitter did not allow aerobatic "idle-up" flying. So he ripped it out and put in a Futaba receiver (Ch 48) to go with his 8ch computer radio that he uses with his Raptor 50. Now there's a problem with yaw stability and the gyro.

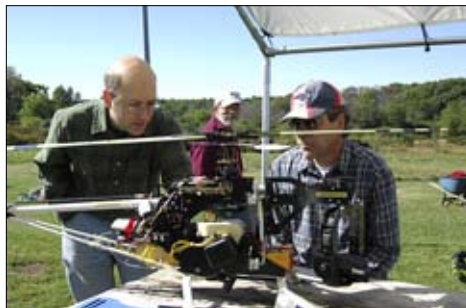

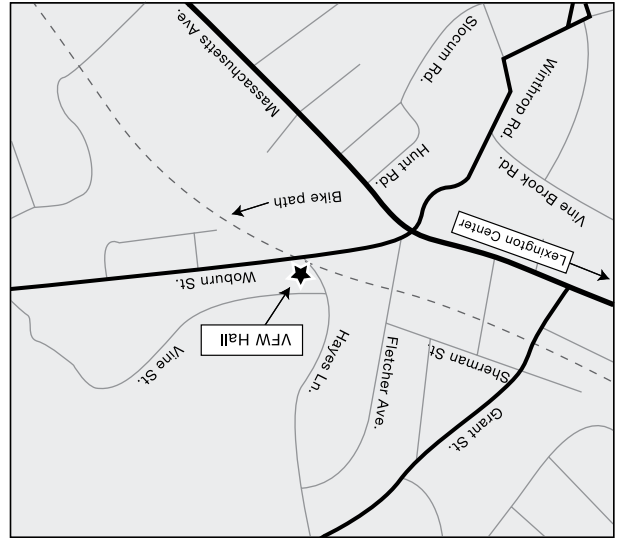

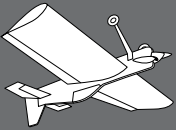
